# **Soverning Council**

The composition of the Governing Council is as follows:

- ➤ The Governing Council of the college is the supreme administrative body.
- ➤ It is constituted as per the norms fixed by AICTE, New Delhi; Affiliating University and Govt. Of TamilNadu.
- The Governing Council is ambitious and converts aspirations into outcomes with a rigorous framework of governance.
- ➤ The Governing Council approves the mission and strategic vision of the institution, long term business plans and annual budgets in accordance to meeting the interests of the stakeholders.
- > The Head of the Institution is appointed as the Chief Executive of the Institution and suitable arrangements are made to monitor his/her performance.
- > The council ensures the establishment and monitoring systems of control and accountability including financial & operational controls and risk assessment; clear procedure for handling internal grievances.
- ➤ Governing Council monitors the institutions performance against the plans approved; and also benchmarks this against other institutions wherever possible.
- ➤ The Governing Council should ensure the achievement of the mission and vision of the organization; future academic plans and research activities should be promoted by providing direction of implementation and overall monitoring of the activities.
- ➤ Governing Council must approve the budgetary allocation towards infrastructure, staffing and R & D.
- ➤ The Chairperson is responsible for leading the governing body, is also responsible for its effectiveness and should ensure that the institution is well connected with the stake holders.

- > The Chairperson should support the head of the institution in execution of the programme.
- > Frequency of meeting of the Governing Council is minimum two times a year or whenever needed.

# Major Responsibilities of the Governing Council

- > To uphold the legal stature of the college in view of AICTE, UGC, State Government and affiliating University (VTU) or any other body or agency.
- > To take decisions regarding the intake and addition or discontinuation of any program accordingly recommending the Principal to take formal steps with the affiliating body to put this into action.
- Fix the fee structure and any charges applicable in accordance with the recommendation of the Central Planning and Budgeting Committee and prescribed fee structure of affiliating university.
- Extension, Renovation or Procurement plans recommended by Central Planning and Budgeting Committee.
- Decide the promotions or penalties as recommended by Central Academic Monitoring Committee.
- Approve the budget and recommend necessary corrections.
- > Nominate and constitute other central committees for smooth discharge of responsibilities.

# Powers and Functions of the Governing Council

The Governing Council shall exercise powers and discharge the functions as follows:

- ➤ Ensure proper management, maintenance and custody of the institution in relation to land, infrastructure, equipment and funds, including loans and grants received from AICTE, Central Government and Government of TamilNadu
- > To ensure good condition of the campus.
- > Instructions are imparted in accordance with norms and standards prescribed by Government of TamilNadu and affiliating University.

- > To ensure approval of appointment of staff by way of selection committee of the institute in accordance with the norms prescribed by AICTE and Government of TamilNadu
- > To ensure implementation of provision of acts, instructions, rules and regulations prescribed by AICTE and Government of TamilNadu in matters of service conditions of staff relating to appointment, leave, Provident Fund, age of retirement and disciplinary actions.
- > To ensure observance and compliance of instructions issued by AICTE, Government of TamilNadu and affiliating University.
- > To ensure that the building, land, furniture and facilities are not being used for any other purpose (such as holding political meetings, communal meetings), except for running AICTE approved courses in the institute.
- > To submit reports and returns from time to time to AICTE, Government of TamilNadu and affiliating University.
- > Create peaceful and favorable atmosphere for study free from ragging.

# **Powers and Functions of Chairperson of Governing Council**

- ➤ The Chairperson shall intimate the date of the Governing Council meeting to the Principal-cum- Member Secretary for arrangement of Governing Council meeting. In case the Principal-cum- Member Secretary fails or ignores to arrange Governing Council meeting, the Chairperson can call for Governing Council meeting.
- ➤ In the event of taking vote on any decision and if a tie occurs, then decision of Chairperson shall be final.
- > The Chairperson shall ensure that the decisions taken in Governing Council meeting are implemented by Member Secretary.
- ➤ The Chairperson shall ensure that the Governing Council is functioning properly to meet the mission of the Institute.

# Powers and Functions of Member Secretary of Governing Council

➤ Member Secretary of Governing Council of the Institute shall be the Principal, who executes the decisions taken in the Governing Council on behalf of the Governing Council.

- ➤ By the order of the Chairperson, Member Secretary shall arrange the Governing Council meeting. In case of unfavouring situations, he/she will intimate the cancellation of the meeting the Chairperson and other members of the Governing Council.
- ➤ He would take correspondence on behalf of the Governing Council meeting in relation with the decisions taken in it and get it confirmed by the Chairperson and members present. With confirmation, the proceedings would be forwarded to AICTE, Government of TamilNadu and affiliating University.
- > The Member Secretary would maintain the properties of the institution and remain in-charge of it, the title deeds and papers related to the need of the institution.
- ➤ He will exercise powers and functions as maybe imposed and assigned by the Governing Council from time to time.
- ➤ The Member Secretary would issue appointment letters to the staffs selected by the Recruitment Committee after the approval from the sponsoring trust and the Governing Council of the institute

#### **PREAMBLE**

Governance is the key activity that acts as a bridge between the management and stakeholders. The institution has a strong governing council made up of different luminaries from various walks of life that devices all policies and decisions related to both academic and administration. To ensure the efficiency and effectiveness of governing council, a number of academic and administrative bodies have been formed with duties and responsibilities. The governing council of the college meets twice in a year, to discuss various issues and aspects contributing to the development of the college. It chalks out a roadmap in order to achieve the goals of the institution.

### MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES OF GOVERNING COUNCIL

- Uphold the legal stature of the college in line with the policies Council of Architecture, State Government and affiliating university (Anna University) or any other body or agency.
- 2. Taking decisions regarding the intake and addition or discontinuing of any program and instructing the Principal to take formal steps with the affiliating body to put this into action.
- 3. Fix the fee structure and any charges applicable in accordance with the recommendation of the affiliating university.
- 4. Approve the budget for the respective financial year.

### **FUNCTIONS OF GOVERNING COUNCIL**

- 1. Amend and approve policies from time to time.
- 2. Approve the appointment of faculty members recommended by the selection committee of the institution in accordance with the norms prescribed by AICTE and Anna University.
- 3. Construction and maintenance of infrastructure and amenities for the institution.
- 4. Review of academic performance of the institution and suggest remedial measures, if required.
- 5. Mobilizes funds and utilize the resources maximum, towards the development of the institution.
- 6. Introduction of new programs and/or increasing intake/closure of programs/reduction in intake.

- 7. Implement the recommendations of IQAC, Planning and Monitoring Board and other committees.
- 8. Review of highlighted feedback summary of stakeholders and planning for corrective actions towards the satisfaction of stakeholders.
- 9. To monitor the academic and other related activities of the college
- 10. To consider and execute the recommendations of the Staff Selection Committee
- 11. To consider the important communications, policy decisions received from the University, Government, AICTE, etc.
- 12. To monitor the students and faculty development programmes
- 13. To pass the annual budget of the college.
- 14. To approve the income and expenditure of the college annually.
- 15. General supervision and control of the affairs of the college
- 16. To fix admission, tuition and other fees to be charged from students reading and/or residing in the College (subject to any limitations laid down by the University).
- 17. To appoint Principals and other members of teaching and non-teaching staff excluding Class-IV employees of the College in accordance with the procedure laid down.
- 18. To make rules and to alter, amend or repeal the same, provided, all such alterations and amendments and repeals receive the approval
- 19. To delegate, at its discretion, any of its power as may be necessary from time to time to the Principal.
- 20. To exercise such other powers and to do such other acts or things as may be necessary or expedient for the proper performance of its duties.

#### CONSTITUTION

The constitution of the Governing Body of a college shall be:

- 2 to 4 Members to be nominated by the Registered Society / Trust
- 5 & 6 Two eminent professionals from the area of Engineering and Technology
- 7 &8 Two academicians of excellence.
- 9 University Nominee
- 10- Nominee of Government of Tamil Nadu (Ex-officio)
- 11 Member Secretary Principal (ex-officio)

# **TERM**

The term of the members, except the ex-officio member, shall be three years.

# **MEETING AND ITS VENUE**

The Governing Council shall meet at least twice a year. All such meetings shall be held within the respective college campus. It shall be the responsibility of the Member Secretary to ensure that the meetings are held regularly and keeps record.

# **QUORUM**

The quorum for the meeting shall be 50% of the total members of the Governing Council.

# POLICY FOR INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL [IQAC]

# **PREAMBLE:**

- 8. College HR Policy explains the organization and standard operating procedure for the quality initiatives on par with the statutory norms and expectations of the institution

# Various Types of drug

The Hon'ble Supreme Court has, inter-alia, mentioned the following as types of ragging:- Ragging has several aspects with, among others, psychological, social, political, economic, cultural, and academic dimensions.

- Any act that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of a student should be considered with in the academics related aspect of ragging; similarly, exploiting the services of a junior student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of seniors is also an aspect of academics related ragging prevalent in many institutions, particularly in the technical institutions.
- Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a junior student by senior students should be considered an aspect of ragging for ragging economic dimensions.
- O Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestured, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person can be put in the category of ragging with criminal dimensions.
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, snail-mails, blogs, public insults should be considered with in the psychological aspects of ragging. This aspect would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to others; the absence of preparing 'freshers' in the run up to their admission to higher education and life in hostels also can be ascribed as a psychological aspect of ragging coping skills in interaction with seniors or strangers can be imparted by parents as well. Any act that affects the mental health and self- confidence of students also can be described in terms of the psychological aspects of ragging.
- The human rights perspective of ragging involves the injury caused to the fundamental right to human dignity through humiliation heaped on junior students by seniors; often resulting in the extreme step of suicide by the victims.

Actions to be taken against students for indulging and abetting in drug in

# technical institutions Universities including Deemed to be University imparting technical education:-

- The punishment to be met out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
- Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities.
- Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.
  - i. Cancellation of admission
  - ii. Suspension from attending classes
  - iii. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
  - iv. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
  - v. Withholding results
  - vi. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
  - Vii. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
  - Viii. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
  - Ix. Fine of Rupees 25,000/-

- X. Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.
- > The institutional authority shall intimate the incidents of ragging occurred in their premises along with actions taken to the Council immediately after occurrence of such incident and inform the status of the case from time to time.
- ➤ Courts should make an effort to ensure that cases involving ragging are taken up on priority basis to send the correct message that ragging is not only to be discouraged but also to be dealt with sternness.

# **POWERS AND FUNCTIONS: ANTI RAGGING**

- ✓ To uphold and comply with the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and be vigilant on any acts amounting to ragging;
- ✓ To publicize to all students prevalent directives and the actions that can be taken against those indulging in ragging;
- ✓ To consider the complaints received from the students and conduct enquiry and submit report to the Anti- Ragging Committee along with punishment recommended for the offenders;
- ✓ Oversee the procedure of obtaining undertaking from the students in accordance with the provisions;
- ✓ Conduct workshops against ragging menace and orient the students;
- ✓ To provide students the information pertaining to contact address and telephone numbers of the person(s) identified to receive complaints/distress calls;
- ✓ To offer services of counselling and create awareness to the students;
- ✓ To take all necessary measures for prevention of Ragging inside the Campus.
- ✓ The Principal / the Anti-ragging committee shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.

# **COMPLAINT PROCEDURE**

Any complaint of ragging should be made to the college appropriate committee by a student, immediately of its occurrence. The committee should complete the enquiry within 24 hours and file a complaint with the police if it is found a student or any other person guilty of ragging.

# **COMMITTEES AND THEIR FUNCTIONS:**

## a. The Anti-Ragging Committee:

The Sree Sowdambika Engineering College Anti-Ragging Committee shall be headed by the Principal and shall consist of representatives of civil and police administration, local media, Non-Government Organizations involved in youth activities, faculty members, parents, students belonging to the fresher's category as well as seniors and non-teaching staff. It shall monitor the Anti-Ragging activities in the institution, consider the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad and take appropriate decisions, including spelling out suitable punishments to those found guilty. The composition of the committee for the current year is as listed under the head 'Committees of the College'.

# b. The Anti-Ragging Squad:

The Anti-Ragging Squad shall be nominated by the Head of the institution with such representation as considered necessary and shall exclusively consist of members belonging to the various sections of the campus community. The Squad shall have vigil, oversight and patrolling functions. It shall be kept mobile, alert and active at all times and shall be empowered to inspect places of potential ragging and make surprise raids on hostels and other hot spots. The Squad shall investigate incidents of ragging and make recommendations to the Anti-Ragging Committee and shall work under the overall guidance of the Anti-Ragging Committee. All matters of discipline within teaching institutions must be resolved within the campus except those impinging on law and order or breach of peace or public tranquility, all of which should be dealt with under the penal laws of the land. The Anti-Ragging Squad shall make surprise raids on the hostel and campus premises without prior notice or without affixed time schedule.

# POLICY FOR DISCIPLINE AND WELFARE COMMITTEE

# **OBJECTIVES:**

The main function of the Discipline and Welfare Committee is to oversee the implementation and the practice of the code of conduct for administrators/ staff/ students and ensure adherence to rules and regulations that govern the management and administration of the College and to implement the various measures taken for the welfare of employees/ students and recommend any further improvements, if required. The committee will be responsible for educating and creating awareness about the code of conduct that governs all stakeholders and also the welfare measures for students and employees.

# **COMPOSITION OF DISCIPLINE AND WELFARE COMMITTEE:**

- Principal is the Chair person of this committee
- A senior faculty member is deputed as Co-ordinator of the Committee
- Physical Director along with a faculty from each department are deputed as Members of Committee.
- A student from final year as the representative of student is also nominated as the member.

# **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Committee facilitates students to apply various scholarships of both Central and State Governments
- Recommendations and Feedback will be submitted to the authorities concerned regarding Transport, Classroom management, Drinking water, Canteen facilities, Waiting hall, etc.,
- Recommendations for activities to be made in support of Higher Education,
   Competitive exams, Industrial visits and Soft skills training.
- The committee also meets with the student's parents if necessary to explicate the downsides of family disputes and their effects upon the student.
- In case the student suffers from a psychological illness, such as anxiety or depression, he will be suggested to a specialized doctor immediately.

- Conducts awareness programme on code of conduct for newly joined students and staff and also on welfare schemes available for stakeholders.
- The committee will initiate the following disciplinary action on erring members and ensure the well being of all stakeholders. One or more of the following programmes of action may be taken when a student has been found to have violated the student code of conduct:
  - Warning: A written letter of reprimand resulting from a student's misconduct.
  - Suspension: Suspension is a sanction that terminates the student's enrolment at the College campus for a specified period of time.
  - Monetary Fines: Monetary Fines is a sanction in which a student is required todeposit amount as penalty or any amount deposited by him is forfeited or adjusted, resulting from misconduct. It also includes Restitution which means making compensation for loss, injury, or damage.
  - Confiscation. Confiscation means confiscation of goods used or possessed in violation of college regulations.
  - Restriction of Privileges Restriction of privileges means the denial or restriction of specified privileges, including, but not limited to, access to a student facilities, placement programmes, college events for a defined period of time.
  - **Dismissal**: Dismissal is a sanction which permanently separates a student from the college campus without opportunity to re-enrol in the future.

#### SERVICE RULES:

Every member of the staff shall agree to abide by all the conditions herein stated and also such conditions as may be stipulated from time to time by the higher authority.

Every member of the staff shall employ honestly, efficiently and diligently under the orders and instructions of the Principal/Designated Authority or other officers under whom they shall, from time to time, be placed. They must discharge all duties pertaining to the college.

Every member of the staff shall devote themselves whole time to the duties of the said employment

Any staff member, on appointment, except on contract, shall be on probation for a period 4. of three months.

All the staff can avail 15 days as casual leave in the tenure of 1. January to 31. December. However, it cannot be carried over to the next year, if not used. Also they can avail 2 permissions per month, one hour either in the morning or evening session (9.15 a.m to 10.15 a.m

or 3.30 p.m to 4.30 p.m).

All the teaching staff can avail summer and winter vacation as per the college norms. If a staff member on vacation has to be out of station, they should intimate the Principal and their Designated Authority their exact out station address and phone numbers in their vacation form. However, they should come and do their duty during the vacation, whenever necessity arises.

Female staffs are eligible to avail maternity leave for 3 months with salary for one child after their one year service in this college and they should work for a period of minimum 3 years

after availing the maternity leave.

All the teaching staff shall be paid AICTE scale of pay and other allowances as per College norms. Only previous Engineering College service experiences are considered during their appointment. Yearly increment will be carried out during 1. January / 1. April/ 1. June / 1. October which depends on the service of individual staff. Promotion norms are as per AICTE norms.

In addition, contribution shall be made by the management towards the employees'

provident fund, at a rate fixed by the Government of Tamil Nadu, on the salary.

10. Staff attendance should be signed every day before the commencement of regular class hours, and at the end of the working hours for the day unless they are on duty outside the campus, or on leave.

Staff should be available in the college premises during the entire period of office hours,

on all working days.

No member of the staff shall apply, during the period of service in this institution, for an appointment outside or send an application for study or training, except with the prior permission of the Principal and Management. Such applications should be routed through the Principal/Designated Authority. Any breach of this rule will be viewed seriously and suitable disciplinary action will be taken.

The Principal shall have the right to place any staff under suspension on charges of misconduct. In a case wherein a member of the teaching or non-teaching staff commits any

misconduct in discharge of their duties, the Principal has got discretion to award punishment such as warning, censure, withholding of increment with or without cumulative effect after conducting an enquiry by a committee constituted by the Principal.

For the development and progress of the college/department, all members of the staff should work as a team and they should also maintain a cordial relationship within and other departments.

The staff should maintain cordial relationship with students, their parents and visitors of 15. our college.

Staff should not show any hesitation whenever extra responsibilities are given. They should voluntarily carry out industrial training, consultancy services, accompanying students for Industrial visits and other department and college developmental activities.

In any meeting or assembly, decorum should be maintained and difference of opinion, if any, shall be expressed politely in diplomatic words without hurting the feelings of others.

It is the responsibility of individual staff to maintain student discipline inside and outside college premises.

Staff members should get prior permission from the Principal to contact any outside agency or government departments for any matter related to the college/ hostels.

If staff members draw advance from the college to meet financial expenses for official tour or for arrangement of a college event, they shall settle the account within 3 days after the completion of the event for which advance was drawn failing which the advance shall be adjusted from their salary.

No staff shall engage in strike or incitement thereto or similar activities such has absence from work or neglect of duties or participate in hunger strike etc., Violation of this rules will

amount to misconduct and attract deterrent punishment.

No staff shall make any statement, publish or write through any media which will effect an adverse criticism of any policy or action of the college or detrimental to the interests of the

23. A staff against whom an Insolvency Proceedings commenced in the court of law shall forthwith report full acts thereof to the college. A staff against whom Criminal Proceedings are initiated in a court of law shall immediately inform the competent authority of the college regarding the details thereof.

24. Staff Members, if and when relinquishing their job, shall hand over their jobs and responsibilities all complete materials and get the NOC from all departments concerned.

#### 25. TERMINATION OF SERVICE

- 25.1. In case of relieving from service, three months' notice at the end of academic year or three months' salary must be given.
- 25.2. The Principal shall have the power to terminate the services of a member of the staff of the college, for any of the following reasons:
- a. Serious misconduct and willful negligence of duty;
- b. Gross insubordination:
- c. Physical or mental unfitness; and
- d. Participation in any criminal offence involving moral turpitude.

In such termination cases, rule 25.1 will not be applicable and the staff member will not be eligible for any terminal benefit.

All members of the staff shall be governed by general rules and norms also practiced by college from time to time. In all cases, the final decision will be taken by the secretary and the Principal.




